WEIGHTED GRADE COMPUTATION

Courses are weighted only to compute cumulative GPA's. Grades on transcripts are actual grades and do not reflect any weight. All AP courses receive an additional weight of 1.0 upon completion of the AP exam (except for AP classes taken in 19-20 & 20-21 ... Exam not required due to Covid-19 Pandemic). Multivariable calculus also receives a 1.0 weight. All MVGS classes, with the exception of Research I, Humanities 10, and Math Analysis, receive an additional 1.0 weight. Weighted cumulative GPA's appear on transcripts.

RANKING & GRADE POINT AVERAGE

For transcript purposes Fauquier County Public Schools does not provide a numerical class rank. A decile rank is reported to college and other institutions upon student request, for undergraduate college admission, scholarships, military and employment application. The decile rank is not provided until the Fall of the Student's Senior year, and is based on their Weighted Cumulative GPA. Courses taken in middle school that award high school credit are included in determining the GPA and determining the decile ranking. All weighted GPA values are computed to three decimal places, ranked from highest to lowest and divided into ten groupings or deciles [1st decile=top 10%, 2nd decile=top 20% and so on to the 10th decile=lowest 10%.]
