To support this student problem of learning, Teachers in K-G5 will integrate a phonemic awareness, phonics-based aspect into their language arts instruction. Heggerity is an evidenced based program that supports teaching both phonics and phonemic awareness.

The school has purchased the teacher resources that support this program for each teacher teaching reading at Grace Miller. The reading teacher will support professional development as needed to integrate this program into what teachers already do in their language arts block.

Teachers in K-2 in addition to special education and ESL teachers will participate in professional development about StoryBook Treasures. Parental Engagement is a key factor in the success of the program. Teachers will complete their training on 11/14/2022 and begin full implementation in December of 2022. The Reading VTSS Team will also develop methods to include families to support literacy at home.
