As you know, in-person (hybrid – two days in-person per week) instruction resumes on Monday, November 9. The new bell schedule will be:

- **Block 4** 1:05pm 2:35pm

ALL students (hybrid and virtual) will follow this schedule.

In-person student are reminded that appropriate facemasks are required. Please note - gaiters, scarves, and bandanas are not acceptable. Social distancing (a minimum of six feet of distance) is required as well. For your planning purposes, microwaves will not be available for students to use during lunch.

The third marking period ends on November 13 and report cards will be available on November 20. In observance of Thanksgiving, there is no school Wednesday, November 25 through Friday, November 27. The first semester ends on Friday, December 17.

As students return to our building, we are expecting more traffic than usual. Please plan accordingly by leaving earlier and allowing for more travel time.

If you drop students off in the morning and/or pick them up in the afternoons, please be mindful of your speed and remember that we have many faculty, staff, and students who walk to and from vehicles. Please do not pass on the double yellow line on Academic Avenue. To avoid traffic backing up

during afternoon pick-up, we ask that you pull into one of our parking lots and park in a space. Your assistance in providing a safe environment is appreciated.


The clinic's fax number is 540-422-7358.
