Important Textbook Information:

CLINIC NEWS:

All medications must be picked up from the clinic by 11:30 am on May 31, 2018 by a parent or a guardian. If not picked up, they will be appropriately discarded.

Care plans for 2018-2019 school year will be available when medication is picked up. There is no appointment necessary. Care plans are written for medically fragile students. Students with severe allergies, asthma, diabetes and seizure disorders are examples of medically fragile. Medication forms will also be available for pick up. Clinic hours are 7:00 am until 3:00 pm. Trex Plastic Bag Recycling:

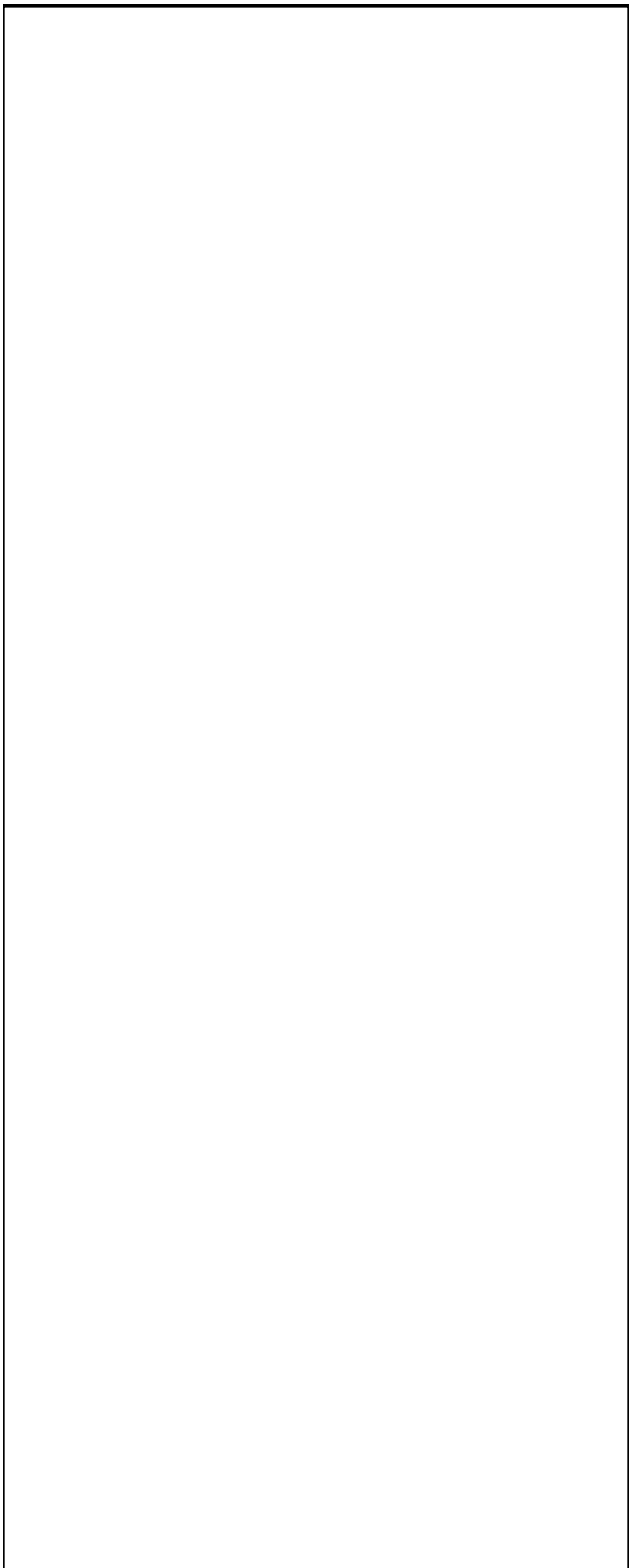
